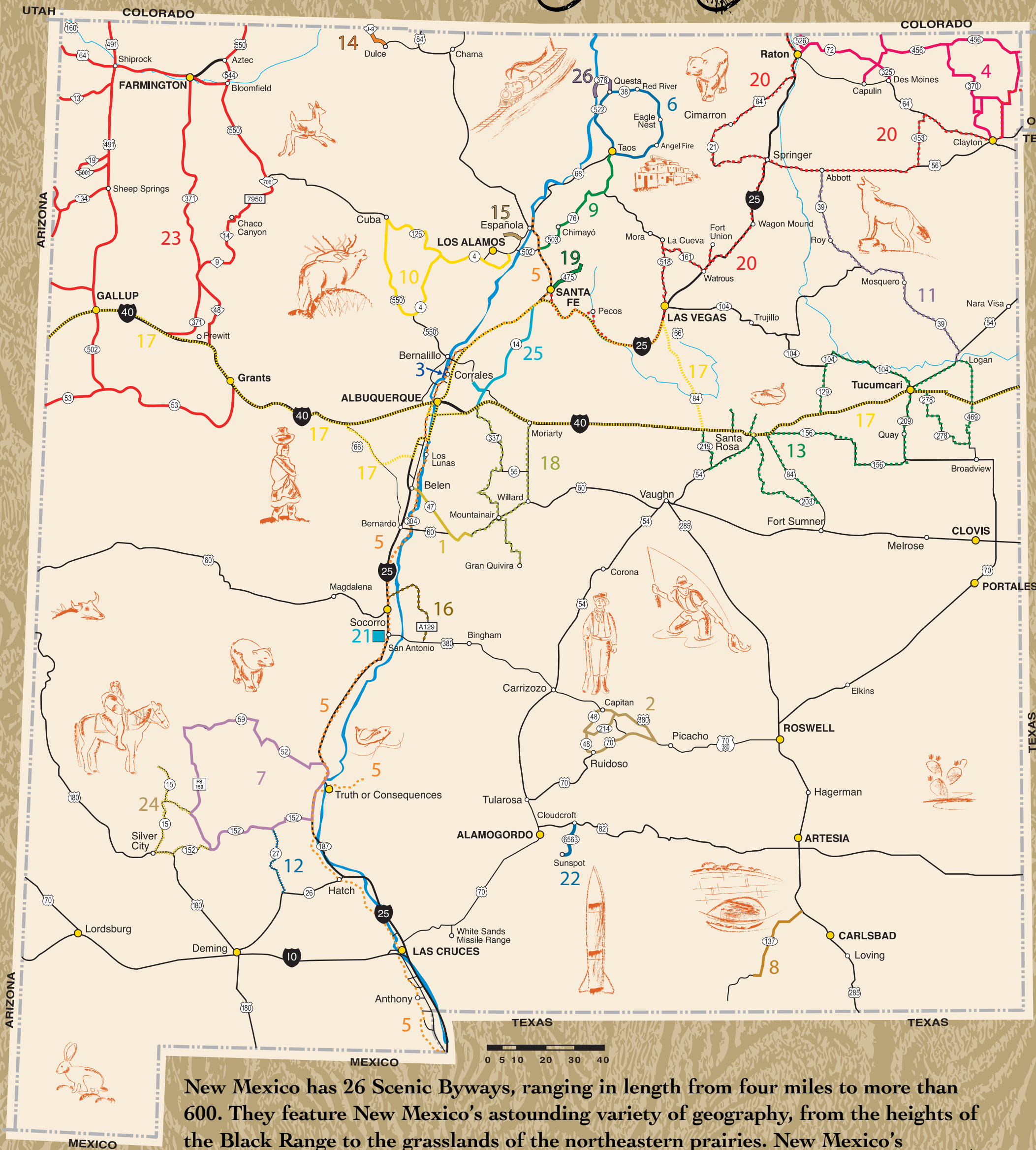


Scenic Byways
